We have some great news about Cox College!

In March the College board of directors approved a Reinvestment Campaign to renovate the 61 year old college facility. The goal is to have the facility mirror the excellence of the education received inside it. In September, a team from Cox College and the CoxHealth Foundation visited the Mabee Foundation in Tulsa, Oklahoma. This private foundation funds construction projects for higher education, hospitals and select not for profits that meet their mission. We have just learned that **Cox College has been awarded a \$1 Million Mabee Foundation Challenge Grant.** This is a huge honor to be selected from the multitudes of applicants seeking support from the Mabee Foundation each year.

The question you might be asking is, "Why is this Reinvestment Campaign so important?" The answer affects us all. We need to know there will be nurses and health professionals in our hospitals when we need care. Nationwide there is a nursing shortage and it's growing larger every day. In Springfield, 700 vacant nursing positions have been reported in 2017. The Missouri Hospital Association identified a 16% nursing vacancy statewide, up 6% from the previous year. Nursing shortages impact patient safety, quality and access to care. As the region's largest educator of nurses, Cox College must be able to recruit nursing students. A loss of graduates means fewer nurses at the bedside. Prospective

students have told Cox College the campus is too outdated. The students are choosing other options for their college choice, or career. Students have made it clear that an updated campus would impact their decision. The Campaign allows the college to reconfigure space, enlarging classrooms and allowing the college to prepare for larger class sizes in coming years. The plan includes replacing window air-conditioning units with modern systems, upgrading technologies and adding new areas for group study and innovation. As a tuition and fee based organization, the only alternative to making the renovations is to raise both. Knowing how students struggle to afford an education today, this was not an option. Increases could only further inhibit a student's ability to choose nursing or health professions.

The Campaign brings the college back to its roots. The college started through a donation and is sustained today through donor support.

Now the challenge is in our hands. We are asking all those who value nurses and the great care they deliver by help us meet the challenge. Cox College will only receive the gift by raising the matching million dollars. Gifts of all size are gratefully received and will be doubled starting today. 
Breast Cancer Awareness
